Iraq and Poland are actively pursuing ways to preserve and resume current research in Iraq. The countries are working on an 11-item agreement which allows the continuation of Polish directed excavations that focus on Mesopotamian culture, conservation efforts, and the curtailing of the looting of the country's artifacts.

NAVY SEARCHES FOR BONHOMME RICHARD

Next month a survey will be undertaken in the rough waters of the North Sea to search for the shipwreck of John Paul Jones, father of the US Navy. Cutting edge technology and new predictive model applications are hoped to narrow down the location and ultimately reveal the grave site of the *Bonhomme Richard*. On 23 September 1779, Jones' ship engaged the *HMS Serapis* in the North Sea and lost. Captain Richard Pearson, commanding *Serapis*, yelled out to Jones, asking if he surrendered; Jones' replied, "I have not yet begun to fight!"


