Preserve America Summit

Mrs. Laura Bush, First Lady of the United States and Honorary Chair of the *Preserve America* initiative, announced that in cooperation with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation she will lead a national *Preserve America* Summit in October 2006 to mark the 40th anniversary of the passage of the National Historic Preservation Act. Those four decades have seen great progress in the stewardship and productive use of America's historic properties, and more opportunities lie ahead. The national *Preserve America* Summit will explore opportunities to build on this progress.

NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE SYSTEM PRESERVE AMERICA GRANT PROGRAM

This program provides competitive grants (\$10,000 - \$15,000) to help fund national wildlife refuge interpretive and education projects focusing on history and historic sites and how they contribute to our conservation and understanding of natural resources.

SOUTHERN RECIPE OF THE MONTH

BBQ RIBS

Take any size rack of ribs and place on foiled cookie sheet and place in oven at 375 degrees for 30 minutes to remove grease. Remove ribs from cookie sheet, baste in BBQ sauce and place in Dutch oven with lid and place back into oven for one hour to further cook and retain moisture. After an hour, remove the ribs and place on grill for 10 minutes to solidify the sauce. Serve with corn on the cob, baked potato, corn bread, and coleslaw.
