- Amphibian and Reptile Database Demo –suggestions and questions
 - Addition of overseas data (OCONUS)
 - o Cross Reference with NMFWA database to show base specific data
 - Federal status is in the database along with NatureServe status
 - Recommended that USGS utilize to update their database that has regional holes in it
 - Database/website uses standard common and scientific species names based on *Scientific* and Standard Names of Amphibians and Reptiles of North America North of Mexico with Comments Regarding Confidence in Our Understanding (Sixth Edition).
 - o Database search will search by partial names of sites
 - Database is current stand alone and available only from Chris Petersen chris.petersen@navy.mil; very large file so must be sent via mail on CD or else via FTP
 - Database will be updated every three years
 - Missing installations can be added
 - Add relevant citation for use of the database (DoD PARC)

- Amphibian Disease Survey Results 2011
 - Samples can be refrigerated for an extended period
 - How to prevent amphibian chytrid fungus (Batrachochytrium dendrobatidis, or "Bd" for short) spread through equipment usage – see PARC website (<u>http://www.parcplace.org/resources/204-amphibian-declines-a-chytridiomycosis.html</u>) and Bd Field Disinfection Protocols under the July 2010 update

Discussion of Future Projects

- Disease Sampling (swabbing) demo (Atlanta Botanical Garden live demonstration by Dr. Danté Fenolio)
 - Equipment: nitrile gloves, several sandwich-sized plastic baggies, sample vials, woodenhandle, cotton-tipped swabs, small pet store "critter carriers" if you need to temporarily house amphibians before swabbing them
 - Do not use powdered latex gloves when handling frogs, lethal to amphibians
 - 30-45 gentle passes total with swab over sides, hands, feet, throat and groin very little pressure is needed, don't want to rub off or injure skin.
 - Recommended adding a drop of ethyl alcohol to swab tip, using refilled eye dropper, just before placing the sample into your sample vial.
 - Sanitize critter carriers between sample sites 5% bleach/water solution

 - Add Legacy website link to shutterfly photo website
 - Looking for more Legacy project ideas related to conservation and management
 - ID links
 - Formation of a database of experts from DoD as a resource
 - Rob Lovich recommended Herp Con Bio as a excellent place to have gray literature published
 - Link to Herp Con Bio available on website (www.herpconbio.org)

Implementation

- Collaborating with the Herp Working Group
 - Regional review of NEPA and INRMPs by colleagues
 - Prioritizing chair and co-chair positions on DoD PARC Steering Committee to Herp Working Group members first
 - Herp Working Group could serve as a technical support to DoD PARC
- Reviewing/ranking Herp Legacy Proposals
 - DOD PARC is setting up a committee and process to review and recommend Legacy projects
 - Would like to have representation from all military Services
- What is the best way for us to communicate?
 - Peter Boice recommended DOD Natural resources.net for information
 - Use of alternate ways of communication has its difficulties
 - The importance of the yearly face to face meeting vital to communication
 - DCO has an online meeting platform that may be useful
 - PARC regional meeting may be a good place for meetings
 - NMFWA and Sustaining Military Readiness conferences are the best current formats due to command support
 - o Joint meetings with DoD PIF are also considered
- Engaging partners (CONUS, OCONUS)

- FWS- Explained a new NRCS initiative "Working Lands for Wildlife" with \$30 million available – this is primarily for private lands, but could be an opportunity for buffer/encroachment area work
- PARC announcements

 - Inventory and Monitoring guidelines available soon
 - Year of the Lizard, newsletter and calendars available www.yearofthelizard.org

Refining priorities from discussion, action items

- DOD PARC is NOT an unfunded requirement
- DOD PARC participation is voluntary
- How to tie in Climate change issues to herp conservation
 - Herp vulnerability analyses for several SE, NE and some other US species coming out soon through PARC
- Funding
 - Does DOD PARC save dollars and support mission is a common question? Yes to both
 - Connect herp conservation and management to compliance requirements
 - Streamline herpetofaunal work across services
 - DOD PARC would like to be involved with reviewing and ranking of Legacy proposals
 - Ranking protocol to be developed and working group to be formed in 2012
- Action Item: How to align DoD PARC regions-PARC or FWS or hybrid model
 - Majority agreed to model DoD PARC organizational structure after that of the FWS regions
- Action Item: How to select region leaders: Chair and co-chair?
 - Must have support from command or supervisors
 - Offer DoD PARC chair and co-chair positions to Herp Working Group Members first
- Action Item: DoD PARC Website
 - o Add workshop attendees as members to the website
 - Continue to add pictures, documents and links
 - Continue to promote and enhance the website
- Action Item: Herpetofauna Database
 - Finalize database and distribute via FTP or CD to members
 - o Investigate adding the database to the Navy Environmental Portal website or DENIX
