KIRTLANDS WARBLER IN CONGRESSIONAL RECORD

Mic and Kirtland's Warblers are now in the Congressional Record.

In a recent communication from Representative Elford A. Ceder-berg he calls attention to his remarks entered into the record at Washington, Wednesday, June 19, 1963, Vol. 109, Page A-3922, concerning the erection of the Kirtlands Monument, including the article appearing in the Oscoda County News on June 6.

Coderberg's recorded remarks also included the history and description of the warbler, the setting aside of 4,000 acres of National Forest Land as a management area as well as 11,000 acres of State land. He dwelt to some length on the tract dedicated to Kirtland's warbler by the U. S. Forest Service on June 1, and included a verbatim quote of Edward P. Cliff's address which was given at this dedication ceremony.
