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### Introduction to the MIDG Matrix

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The Military Installation Fire Management In-Briefing Development Guidebook (MIDG) Matrix serves as a reference summary for fire managers. It is split into two parts: Part I is a summary of key points for preparing In-Briefing materials and Part II is a cross-reference of existing guidance for developing In-Briefing materials. Part I describes the key takeaways for each task when preparing In-Briefing materials, as well as which In-Briefing materials are most appropriate for the type and level of incident (e.g., verbal briefing, Incident Action Plan (IAP), Mobilization Guide, or In-Briefing Packet). Part II is dedicated to pre-existing forms, manuals, and guidance that fire managers can reference when preparing In-Briefing materials. While not a comprehensive list, the MIDG Matrix can be referenced for examples while fire managers are preparing In-Briefing products in the pre-planning phase. When using these resources, **be sure to apply your service-branch specific regulations**.

The MIDG Matrix is organized by the sections found in the MIDG (Plans, Operations, Logistics, Finance/Administration, and Public Information / Public Affairs). Please see the description prior to Part I and Part II for an explanation of the corresponding columns.

# Part I – Pre-Planning Key Points

**Tasks** 

This column correlates to the Task in the MIDG.

#### **Pre-Planning**

This column aids installation fire managers in preparing a verbal briefing, an Incident Action Plan (IAP), a Mobilization Guide, and an In-Briefing Packet for incoming resources. It also assists fire managers in identifying and connecting with key players who may support their fire management program, and identifies additional essential planning documents (Wildland Fire Management Plan, preattack plan, Delegation of Authority, etc.). This lengthy process should happen prior to planned events and ideally well in advance of suppression incidents.

## **Conducting Planned Event**

This column guides installation fire managers in compiling In-Briefing information for temporary, pre-identified resources who will support planned events (e.g., prescribed fires) and potentially unplanned events (e.g., wildfire suppression). Resources could include partners, cooperators, detailers, etc. Since these resources are pre-identified, they should receive the Mobilization Guide well in advance of the planned event to ensure standards are met. Once on-installation, these resources should receive the verbal briefing, IAP, and In-Briefing Packet.

#### **Expanding Suppression Incident**

This column supports installation fire managers in compiling In-Briefing information for incoming resources that will support the management of an expanding wildfire suppression event (e.g., cooperators, partners, FES, etc.). Ideally, fire managers should provide the Mobilization Guide in advance of the resources being dispatched to ensure standards and agreements are met. Once resources are on-installation, fire managers should share an updated verbal briefing and IAP and provide the

In-Briefing Packet to incoming resources.

This is different from the 'Conducting Planned Event' column in that the verbal briefing and IAP need to be updated as the incident evolves. Since an expanding suppression incident is not a pre-planned event, it is possible the incoming resources may be unknown.

### Transitioning to IMT

This column assists installation fire managers in compiling information for an In-Briefing packet which is given to incoming Incident Management Team (IMT). This involves a Delegation of Authority and Fire Management Planning guides developed during the pre-planning phase. Additionally, fire managers should share their IAP, Mobilization Guide, and In-Briefing Packet to assist the IMT in their transition and planning.
