






Did You Know In MISSISSIPPI

Mississippi National Guard

The Guard organizes, trains, and equips over 17,000 officers and enlisted personnel to ensure quick mobilization for deployment within the state or world-wide. Unique within DOD, the Guard serves the Governor and President in time of national crisis. A reflection of its citizen-soldiers and airmen, MS NG contributes to the state collectively through regional armories and major military training facilities.



Columbus Air Force Base

Columbus AFB is home to the busiest military air traffic control facility in the world. The host unit, assigned to the Air Education and Training Command Nineteenth Air Force, is the 14th Flying Training Wing (14 FTW). The 14 FTW provides specialized undergraduate pilot training for the U.S. Air Force and allied officers. About half of today's Air Force pilots go through basic and primary flight training at Columbus.



Camp Shelby

Camp Shelby is the largest state-owned training site in the nation, encompassing 136,000 acres. During wartime, the camp serves as a major, independent mobilization station. Camp Shelby accommodates battalion-level maneuver training, field artillery firing points and a wide range of support facilities. It is the usual annual training location for National Guard and Reserve units located in MS, AL and TN, although units from across the country use its assets to support a variety of missions.



Keesler AFB

Keesler Air Force Base is home of the Second Air Force Headquarters and the Air Education and Training Command (AETC), 81st Training Wing. The installation is one of the largest technical training wings in AETC, with approximately 4,700 students on base at any given time. Also located at Keesler, the 81st Medical Group, operates the second largest medical center in the Air Force.



Naval Air Station Meridian

NAS Meridian, a military airport located 11 miles northeast of Meridian, MS, is one of the Navy's two jet strike pilot training bases. The Air Station trains Sailors and Marines in aviation and technical related fields, and provides safe, efficient air operations, high quality service and facilities, and a safe and secure environment.
