



National Guard and Other Reserve Components

The Guard and Reserve organize, train, and equip citizen soldiers/airmen to ensure their rapid mobilization for duties within the state, nation and around the world. While all Reserve Components have a federal mission to augment active duty forces in times of crises, the Guard has the additional, unique mission of serving the Governor during state emergencies. Guard and Reserve units are stationed throughout the state.



Pope Field

The Air Force 43rd Airlift Group was activated at Pope in 2011. The unit performs en route operations support, such as mission command and control, aircrew management, and aircraft maintenance, loading, fueling and supply. The Fort Bragg Garrison is the host organization to Pope Field. The Garrison provides airfield support, security and protection, to include emergency medical and fire response, aircraft security and transient alert support.



Seymour Johnson Air Force Base

Seymour Johnson houses the 4th Fighter Wing, as well as the multi-role, all-weather F-15E Strike Eagle and the 916th Air Refueling Wing. The 3,300-acre installation provides worldwide deployable aircraft and personnel capable of executing combat missions to support the Aerospace Expeditionary Force.



US Coast Guard Air Station Elizabeth City

Located along the Albemarle Sound, Elizabeth City is the busiest Coast Guard air station in the U.S., operating missions as far away as Greenland, the Azores and the Caribbean. The Support Center is the home of Coast Guard aviation, and houses AS Elizabeth City, the Aircraft Repair and Supply Center, and the Aviation Technical Training Command in execution of homeland security and maritime safety missions.



Fort Bragg

At 167,000 acres, Fort Bragg is one of the largest and busiest military complexes in the world. The installation hosts the only U.S. airborne corps and airborne division, the "Green Berets" of the Special Operations Command, and the Army's largest support command. The 82nd Airborne Division Soldiers and others make 100,000 parachute jumps each year at Fort Bragg.



Marine Corps Air Station New River

As the only East Coast rotary wing installation, New River and tenant commands are vital in the training, readiness and deployment of worldwide Marine Corps aviation forces. With over 3,600 acres, New River houses over 6,000 Marines, Sailors, and civilians, CH-53E "Super Stallions," CH-46 "Sea Knights," MV-22 "Ospreys," UH-1N "Hueys," and AH-1W "Super Cobras."



Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune

Among other combat units and support commands, Camp Lejeune's 156,000 acres houses the II Marine Expeditionary Force, the 2nd Marine Division, and the 2nd Marine Logistics Group. Eleven miles of beach are available to support amphibious operations.



Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point

Cherry Point is the largest Marine Corps air station, and home to the 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing. The installation and associated support locations train 9,530 Marines and Sailors, and occupy over 29,000 acres. Its runway system is so large that the air station served as an alternate emergency landing site for space shuttle launches out of Cape Canaveral.
