



Department of Defense Mission


The mission of the Department of Defense (DoD) is to provide the military forces needed to deter war and ensure our nation's security.

Sustainability and the DoD Mission

DoD facilities on land, on the water, and in the air protect our nation. The Regional Environmental Coordinator (REC) works cooperatively with state agencies and governments on environmental efforts to ensure continued use of necessary land, sea, and airspace – protecting the military's ability to maintain operations into the future and prepare U.S. service men and women to defend our country.

DoD and State Partnerships

Through the REC program, DoD and military service representatives partner with state agencies and governments to strengthen environmental restoration and protection efforts and to promote long-term sustainability of the military mission. Program efforts include educating state agencies and officials about the military's operational and environmental needs, priorities, and concerns; communicating coordinated DoD positions on issues affecting military sustainment; and engaging in state legislative and rulemaking initiatives.

Chesapeake Bay Program

As a landowner and member of the Bay community, DoD is committed to restoring and protecting the Chesapeake Bay and its watershed and has established a joint DoD Chesapeake Bay Program.

The mission of the program is to incorporate restoration, pollution prevention, and stewardship initiatives for the Chesapeake Bay into DoD's mission of providing the military forces needed to deter war and protect and ensure our nation's security. The program facilitates partnerships to strengthen Bay restoration and protection efforts and engage all levels of DoD military, civilians, and their families to become environmental stewards of the watershed.



1 Naval Air Station (NAS) Oceana

NAS Oceana is the Navy's East Coast Master Jet Base, home to F/A-18 Super Hornets. The primary mission of NAS Oceana is as a Shore-Based Readiness Integrator, providing the facilities, equipment, and personnel to support shore-based readiness, total force readiness, and maintain operational access of Oceana-based forces. The base, including Dam Neck Annex and Naval Auxiliary Landing Field Fentress, has approximately 10,500 active Navy personnel, about 10,000 family members, and 4,500 civilian personnel, making NAS Oceana the largest civilian employer in Virginia Beach. The installation hosts the NAS Oceana Air Show, which draws an international crowd of over a quarter of a million spectators annually.



2 Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Distribution Richmond

DLA Distribution Richmond, VA, receives, stores, maintains, manages, and distributes material to the Army, Marines, Navy, and Air Force, while also providing premium distribution services for DLA Disposition Services and Foreign Military Sales program. The distribution center serves as DLA Distribution's primary site for hazardous material with Environmental Protection Agency-conforming storage space. It is also the primary DoD repository for Ozone Depleting Substances, which includes a compressed gas reclamation and cylinder refurbishment operation. Today, DLA Distribution Richmond is responsible for inventory and worldwide physical distribution of all maps, charts, and other geodetic material for DoD, storing 85,000 map items for its military customers worldwide.



3 Joint Base Langley-Eustis

The 633rd Airbase Wing—host organization for Joint Base Langley-Eustis—provides installation support to more than 9,000 military and civilian personnel including Headquarters Air Combat Command and three operational wings. The base provides mission-ready expeditionary airmen to combatant commanders in support of joint and combined operations worldwide.




4 Naval Station Norfolk

Naval Station Norfolk covers 6,200 acres, plus outlying properties, and contains more than 600 significant facilities and 326 tenant commands. The installation has 13 piers and an 8,000-foot airfield, supporting more than 59 ships and more than 187 aircraft and 18 squadrons. Naval Station Norfolk supports the operational readiness of the U.S. Atlantic Fleet, providing facilities and services to enable mission accomplishment.

5 Marine Corps Base Quantico

The Marine Corps Installations National Capital Region – Marine Corps Base Quantico commands and controls assigned organizations and provides facilities and services to tenant commands, military and civilian personnel, and family members in order to promote and sustain training, readiness, and facilitate Inter-Agency, Joint, and Service-level missions. It is here, at the *Crossroads of the Marine Corps*, that vital concepts, training, and equipment of the future are developed.



6 Fort Belvoir

Fort Belvoir provides logistical and administrative support to 90 diverse tenant and satellite organizations. Established in 1915, the fort is the headquarters of the U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command and the U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command, as well as 19 other Army agencies, 8 elements of the U.S. Army Reserve and Army National Guard, and 26 DoD agencies. A U.S. Navy construction battalion, Marine Corps detachment, U.S. Air Force activity, and an agency from the Department of the Treasury are also located at Fort Belvoir.



7 Pentagon

The Pentagon is the headquarters of the DoD and is located in Arlington County, VA across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C. The Pentagon is one of the world's largest office buildings. Approximately 23,000 employees, both military and civilian, work in the Pentagon contributing to the planning and execution of the defense of our country.



National Guard and Reserve Components


The Virginia National Guard and Reserve organize, train, and equip citizen soldiers and airmen for rapid mobilization in the state, nation, and around the world. While all Reserve components have a federal mission to augment active duty forces in times of crises, the Guard has the unique mission of serving the Governor during state emergencies.




Defense Spending by State

By Service







Allocation, By Type


